


Fast Facts

- Multi-day tournaments will have positive economic impact on the community.
- Three years is the average extended lifespan from regular exercise.
- America's youth average only 20 minutes of outdoor play per day.
- 600+ athletic competitions were held in Wayne Park in 2013 with over 1,050 children participating.
- Presently most recreational activities occur in Wayne Park which is past safe capacity.
- Waverly's population is projected to double in the next 25 years.
- We desperately need more park and recreation space in Waverly!

Time Line (subject to funding)

Phase 1 is complete including main baseball field, multipurpose fields, a walking path, trees and a parking lot.

Phase 2 will include concession stand/restroom, baseball field lights, a shelter, a maintenance building, trees and a nature area. Targeted completion October 2015. Phases 3&4 will include three additional lighted ball fields, multipurpose fields, batting cages, a playground, a shade structure, and a south restroom.
