

POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

2022

- Swimmers 8 years old and under must be accompanied by a responsible person 13 years of age or older AT ALL TIMES.
- All persons entering the pool MUST PAY, even when not swimming.
- No persons having a contagious disease, infectious conditions, and/or open wounds will be allowed in.
- Waverly Parks and Recreation reserves the right to refuse admission to those who may be under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or those exhibiting erratic behavior.
- Alcohol, smoking, tobacco products and illegal drugs are not allowed.
- Bathing suits are required. No thongs, cutoffs, denim or athletic shorts allowed.
- Pool furniture is available on a first come, first serve basis.
- A 10-minute safety check will be called every hour at five minutes to the hour. Only adults 18 years of age and older are permitted to stay in the pool during safety check.
- Children under 18 must stay behind the blue walk path during safety checks.
- No running, pushing, rough play or profanity is allowed.
- Spitting, spouting water, or blowing one's nose in the water is prohibited.
- All food and drinks (except water) MUST BE consumed inside the picnic area.
- No glass containers or bottles allowed.
- ONLY Coast Guard certified personal flotation devices are allowed. ALL flotation devices MUST BE inspected by pool staff prior to entry. Users MUST stay in the shallow area of the pool and be accompanied by an adult who is in the water at all times.
- Pool float toys are not permitted in the pool during peak hours of the day (1:00-5:00 PM). Pool float toys may be brought into the pool after 6pm, if approved by the Pool Manager or Head Guard.
- No hanging or climbing on the guard stands, railings, ladders, lane lines or fences.
- No diving except in the diving well and from the diving board.
- Swim pants are required for children who are not toilet trained due to the Center for Disease Control recommendations.
- The City of Waverly is NOT responsible for lost or stolen items.
- Any patrons who do not comply with these rules and regulations may be asked to leave the premises.
 - A probationary list will be maintained.
 - 1st offense: Expelled and barred for the rest of the day.
 - 2nd offense: Expelled and barred for one week (7 days).
 - 3rd offense: Expelled and barred for the remainder of the season. In the event that the offender is a minor, a letter or email will be sent to his/her parents by the pool manager.

CLOSING POLICY: The facility may close at the discretion of the manager, based on inclement weather, mechanical problems or because of a fecal incident with no refunds due to the patrons.
